Windy Hills continues to be a fiscally sound city, working within our annual budget and will continue the 40% discount for 2017/2018 property taxes. Also a new garbage contract with Waste Management has been approved. Services will remain the same.



Tax And Budget Ordinances For FY 2017/2018

The Tax and Budget Ordinances are published in this newsletter. The tax rate stays the same at \$.17 per \$100 of assessed value and our discount remains at 40%. The discount applies to taxes paid during October.

This budget shows \$577,986 in anticipated revenue in the general fund and expenditures of \$577,986 for a balanced budget. This budget includes \$28,784 for City Improvements and an Emergency Fund of \$14,000. The remaining balance in the General Fund is \$828,007.

This budget show \$40,112 in anticipated revenue in the Road Fund vs. Estimated Expenditures of \$59,000 with the difference coming from reserves.

Maisie Hoge's Little Free Library

For her 9th birthday, Maisie Hoge's Uncle Peyton built her own Little Free Library. It is located at the intersection of Southview Drive and Merrifield Road. She encourages people to visit the library and bring or take books to read. This is the second Little Free Library in Windy Hills. The other one is at Sojourn Community Church on Rudy Lane.



Alley Cat Advocates

Should you discover a stray cat in your neighborhood, take it to a vet and see if it has a chip indicating its owner. If it is truly a stray and you don't want to adopt it, you can turn to Alley Cat Advocates for help.



The mission of this not-for-profit group is to provide for the humane treatment of unowned cats in metropolitan Louisville. It will help you trap the animal, take it in to neuter it, and return it to its environment. The objective is to reduce the unowned cat population by preventing stray cats from breeding. Once the procedure is completed, the cat will have a notched ear to indicate that it is neutered. If an unnotched, unchipped cat comes around your home, you can call 502 630-8777 to begin the trap-neuter-return process. To learn more about it, go to alleycatadvocated.org.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE ADOPTION OF A BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF WINDY HILLS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2017 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2018, ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT.

WHEREAS, a Budget Proposal and Mcssage have been prepared and delivered to the City Council, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed such budget proposal and made necessary modification, now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF WINDY HILLS

CITY OF WINDY HILLS

ORDINANCE NO. 1 Series 2017/2018

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE LEVY OF AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE CITY PURPOSES FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2018

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 83, Series 1973, the City of Windy Hills elected to use the annual County assessment for properties situated in the City of Windy Hills, and

WHEREAS, there has been deposited with the City Clerk a complete list of all taxable property located within the City as of January 1, 2017.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF WINDY HILLS:

Section 1 The tax rate for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, is herby levied and fixed at the rate of \$0.170 per \$100.00 of property as assessed for taxation.

Section 2 The City Clerk shall make out and mail tax bills, sequentially numbered, from the assessment rolls as certified on or before October 1, 2017.

Section 3 The payment of tax bills shall be made to the City Treasurer and shall be subject to the discounts and penalties listed below and the collection remedies provided by law.

- A. A discount of 40% shall be allowed on tax bills paid during October, 2017.
- B. The face amount of a tax bill shall be payable during November and December, 2017.
- C. On tax bills paid after December 31, 2017, there shall be added thereto a penalty of 10% of the tax due plus interest from the date due at 1-1/2% per month or part thereof, compounded monthly, or \$10.00 if the penalty and interest are less than this amount, plus lien filing and release fees.
- D. All delinquent tax collection expenses incurred by the city, including lien filing and release fees, and collection/attorney's fees of \$150, shall be deemed a penalty in addition to that specified in Subsection "c" above and shall be encompassed within the City's lien.

Section 4 The proceeds of such taxes shall be used for the general operating expenses of the City, including the purchasing of City supplies, the erection of City signs, the general maintenance of public ways in the City, payment of bond premiums for City officials, sanitation, public safety and the payment of all the expenses incurred in the necessary and proper municipal functions as may be properly ordained or resolved by the City Council.

Section 5 The ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

First Reading held May 8, 2017; Second Reading, Passed and Approved, June 12, 2017.

Home And Auto Security

We had a number of incidents in the area. A house



in Graymoor/Devondale was broken into and the perpetrators were checking autos in Windy Hills for valuables. A resident got a license number and two of the three perpetrators were apprehended. We are again including the precautions residents should take.

When your vehicle is parked outside or in an unlocked garage, it should be locked. If your vehicle is not parked in a locked garage, don't leave anything of value where it can be seen and the best is to not leave anything of value in the vehicle at all. In most modern vehicles, if a burglar gets inside the passenger compartment, the trunk can be opened with a button or a lever so it may not be secure. If you don't have a garage, a motion sensor light on or near your driveway may be a deterrent.

Be alert to strange vehicles or people in the area when you are coming or going and if you see something suspicious don't hesitate to call the **Graymoor/Devondale**Police at 242-2980. Ask that the call be reported to the Graymoor/Devondale Police. If it's an emergency, dial 911.

"Reach Alert" Saves The Day! Family And Pet Are Reunited!

A young golden retriever by the name of Butters recently decided to go exploring in his Windy Hills neighborhood. He found his way out of his fenced vard and, without his collar, decided a walk along Rudy Lane to the Brownsboro Shopping Center was in order. Dr. Steven Moody of the Brownsboro Animal Clinic (4310 Brownsboro Rd.) saw Butters in the Center's parking lot and noticed he was unaccompanied. Dr. Moody ran outside and called to the friendly dog who came to him with tail wagging. About this time Butter's absence was discovered and his family, the Vogelsangs, immediately began a search. Adam Vogelsang, who is a member of Windy Hill's Reach Alert program, also called Sandy Moore at Windy Hills City Hall. Sandy sent a message to the 333 people currently signed up for alerts from this system. Judith Jones, a member of the Brownsboro Animal Clinic's staff and a Reach Alert member, got the alert and notified Adam. In less than 2 hours the system brought family and lost pet back together.

The City of Windy Hills is in a trial run situation with Reach Alert until the end of this year when the City will decide whether to continue or not. We have approximately 1100 households and about 2400 people in our fair city. We have set an arbitrary goal of 600 members or ½ of our population as a make or break number by December 1. The system is free to anyone

who lives or works in Windy Hills and signing up couldn't be easier. There are 3 ways you can be reached with alerts: text message, email, or phone call with recorded message. We can send out an alert 24/7, so the system is always available for any type of emergency or advisory.

New Garbage Contract

At a Special City Council meeting on May 19, 2017 the Council voted to accept the bid from Waste Management to continue with twice weekly trash pickup, and year-round once weekly yard waste collection. The new contract is effective July 1, 2017 and you will not notice any change in your service.



We have included a one-page special section that we hope you will post in a convenient place for future reference.





NEW GARBAGE COLLECTION, YARD WASTE, AND RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS

Effective July 1, 2017, the City has entered into a new garbage collection contract with Waste Management Inc., our current contractor.

Waste Management was determined to be the lowest and best bidder for the new contract.

The City will continue to have twice weekly rear-door collection. The collection guidelines follow:

- ALL garbage collections will continue on Tuesdays and Fridays, with the following exceptions:
 - Waste Management observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day.
 - b. A collection will be made up (a) where an observed holiday is on a Monday, all collections will be made on (1) day later that entire week, and (b) where the holiday is to be observed on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, then those remaining collections will be made on (1) day later that week.
- 2. Three 30-gallon containers (or equivalent) are the limit at the rear of the residence or the curb, whichever the resident may choose. However, if unusual circumstances such as moving in or out, cleaning out a basement or a garage or the like, warrant additional services on occasion, Waste Management agrees to make these reasonable additional pickups, but these containers shall be placed at the curb for pickup. This extra service does not apply to scrap iron, concrete blocks, building materials, discarded appliances, or other heavy articles. Residents may make arrangements for removal of such articles with Contractor at a fair charge to be agreed upon between the resident and Waste Management.
- Yard Waste will be picked up, at the curb, on Mondays throughout the year. No Yard Waste collection at the Condominiums.

PLEASE RETAIN AND POST IN A CONVENIENT PLACE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

- 4. Yard Waste includes nearly all materials suitable for composting, and includes grass, leaves, twigs, small limbs, plant residue, and the like. A maximum of twelve (12) bags, cans or bundles will be picked up at one time. Bags must be paper or biodegradable plastic.
- Yard Waste may not be commingled with garbage. If it is mixed, it will neither be picked up as yard waste nor as garbage.
- Christmas trees will be removed each year on the regular pickup schedule and there is no special preparation required, such as cutting into certain lengths or tying into bundles. Christmas trees shall be placed at the curb.
- 7. Weekly collection of RECYCLING is now available on a subscription basis from Waste Management. The cost to be billed directly to the homeowner who chooses recycling is \$3.50 per month from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019, and \$5.25 per month for the option year if the contract is renewed.
- Recyclable materials consist of newsprint, glass, aluminum cans, bi-metal cans, and plastic coded No. 1 thru No. 6, and such other items generally considered as recyclable.
- To contract for RECYCLING, call Waste Management Customer Service at 1-866-237-7019 with account number 169216991.

Garbage or yard waste cannot be placed at street prior to 7:00 p.m. on day prior to collection and all cans must be removed by 7:00 p.m. on collection day.


