While March brought in the worst of winds, it brought out the best of people. I want to thank all our citizens of Windy Hills for their patience and understanding as we cope with the aftermath of the worst winds we have seen in some time. A few people had damage to their homes from the falling trees. Our thoughts are with you, and we hope you can move back into your homes soon. Over 250 homes lost power for a significant amount of time – we thank everyone who helped their neighbors by sharing freezer space, electricity, and generators until power was restored. I want to especially thank Councilman Steve Teaford, Adam Volgelsang, and his crew from Brownsboro Lawn Care for their rapid response to clear our roads of the downed trees so that emergency vehicles could get through. Lastly, a big thank you to all the men and women from LG&E and ComEd who worked long hours in

our city to restore our power. At one time, I counted 10 ComEd trucks and over 20 workers on one street alone.

While the winds are gone, debris remains. EcoTech will pick up small loads of tree limbs, branches, and shrubs as part of the Yard Waste Pickup on Mondays. Remember, the debris must be in biodegradable paper bags or cans or bundled and tied with rope or string. All twigs, branches, and shrubs must be no more than 6 inches in diameter and no more than 4 feet in length. These containers/bundles must weigh 50 pounds or less for the safety of the workers. Also, just so you know, it is against the law to burn brush in the Metro Louisville area. Please take a look at the article, in this newsletter, for more information.

Nick Clark - Chief at St. Mathews Fire & EMS

Chief Nick Clark has been at the helm of the St. Matthews Fire Department as chief since August 2022. He was appointed to the position by the St. Matthew Fire District Board of Trustees following the retirement of Chief William Seng, who served 30 years in the role.

Chief Clark grew up in the Buechel area, attended St. Xavier High School, and has a B.S. in Fire Science from Eastern Kentucky University. Clark began his career in 1988 as a volunteer with the Buechel Fire Department. He decided to become a full-time firefighter following 9/11.

In the spring of 2002, he was accepted into a full-time position. Chief Clark was promoted.



to Sergeant in August 2005 and served in that role until September 2018. He was then promoted to Captain and served in that position until he was hired as Chief on August 1, 2022.

Firefighting is in his blood as his father, Jack, was a longtime volunteer with the Buechel Fire Department, and one of his brothers, Dan, is a retired firefighter.

Clark has numerous fire service certifications, including Incident Safety Officer, Fire Officer II, and State Certified Fire Inspector, with more than 25 years of experience in fire service, safety, training, facilities management, and strategic planning.

In 2016, Louisville Metro Emergency Services teamed up with Bullitt, Oldham, Nelson, and Washington Counties to create a regional emergency notification system -Louisville Emergency Notification System (LENSAlert). Its enhanced capabilities include using all communications modes to send alerts - mobile phones, landlines, email, and text. In addition to receiving notifications, individuals can create a Safety Profile for themselves and their household that can include any information they want 9-1-1 and first responders to have in an emergency. When individuals make an emergency call, their Safety Profile is automatically displayed to the 911 call taker, allowing them to send the proper responders to the correct location with the right information. Information about

medical history, allergies to medication, the number of residents in a home, and even a picture of the family dog can all be added to a Safety Profile. Opt-in for LENSAlert with your cell phone. Text "LENSAlert" to 67283 to start receiving emergency notifications or visit LouisvilleKy.gov for more information.

The City of Windy Hills subscribes to Reach Alert, which alerts residents of emergencies and other critical information that is specific to our community, Windy Hills, such as blocked roads, garbage delays, or even lost pets. Users can register multiple devices and have the option to designate which platforms notify them- text message, voice call, or email. To sign up, go to www.reachalert.com or call 877.307.9313




Rental Ordinance and Inspection Program

This Ordinance intends to establish a base standard to prevent or correct conditions that exist or could exist in the future. The Ordinance requires all rental housing in the City of Windy Hills to be registered with the City. The program is based on an ordinance that requires the exterior inspection of all rental housing within the City of Windy Hills. The Code Enforcement Officer inspects the properties for compliance with state and local property maintenance laws. The inspector will look for several things, including junk cars, dead vegetation, accumulations of junk and debris, landscape maintenance, building maintenance, graffiti, adequate refuse facilities, illegal/unpermitted construction, dilapidated structures, and substandard housing conditions as delineated in the Metro land development ordinances. Once an inspection is complete, the owner is notified of any deficiencies found and asked to correct them within ten business days. Windy Hills has approximately 60 rental homes that get inspected throughout the year. Like all our Ordinances, the purpose of this City Ordinance is to ensure that Windy Hills remains a safe place to live and to enhance the value of our properties.

Open Burning Regulations

It is illegal to burn trash and yard waste in Louisville. However, certain recreational, ceremonial, agricultural, and fire training open burns may be considered lawful if you follow the law and obtain the required permits. Basic guidelines may be found below, and more detailed information can be found in APCD Regulation 1.11: Control of Open Burning at www.louisvilleky.gov. If you plan to burn, you must know and follow open burning rules and regulations and obtain any required permits.


