WINDY HILLS TREE BOARD CARE OF TREES ALONG AMBRIDGE DRIVE FALL 2023

Sixty nine (69) 2-11" tree planted in the R-O-W on both sides of Ambridge Drive. (from Rudy Lane to Westport Road.)

PHASE ONE: Fall 2023

- Trees to be structurally pruned to remove rubbing/crossover/parallel limbs which will thin their
- canopies for wind penetration.
- Remove suckers at the base of the trees and thin upward-growing sprouts.
- Remove major visible deadwood and stubs.
- Raise to 7'-8' over sidewalks for pedestrian traffic.
- Raise 12'-15' over the street for vehicle traffic.
- Reduce longest tips to shape as needed.
- Excavate and sever girdling roots as needed.

PHASE TWO: Spring 2024

• Fertilize all trees (except those recommended for removal) in the Fall with a root stimulant (low nitrogen).

PHASE THREE: Spring 2024

• Remove grass and install 2"-3" deep mulch ring around trees as needed. (Some trees may be mulched by residents/homeowners.
