# **Don't Top That Tree**



Windy Hills Ordinance 95.04 makes it unlawful to top any street tree unless it is severely storm-damaged or deemed necessary by a utility company.

Topping is defined as cutting back limbs to stubs larger than 3 inches in diameter within the tree's crown, causing the removal of the normal canopy and disfigurement of the tree. Topping makes the tree weaker as its ability to produce food through photosynthesis diminishes, resulting in fewer leaves. This makes the tree more vulnerable to insects and disease. The tree will also become unsightly as it sends out new branches below the cut to make up for its lost canopy, commonly known as "witch brooms."

In addition, these new branches are usually weaker and could fall in a high wind, posing a potential danger to people or property and leading to a possible lawsuit. Well-maintained trees increase property value, and an unappealing tree can decrease it.

# **Becoming a Candidate**



If you are interested in being a Councilperson, here is a step-by-step approach based on my learned experience:

- 1. Clear this with your spouse or significant other!
- 2. Clear this with your spouse or significant other, AGAIN!
- 3. Keep in mind elections in Windy Hills are non-partisan. You should think of yourself as a citizen of Windy Hills rather than identifying yourself as a member

4. Councilpersons must be at least 18 years of age, a resident of the city for not less than one year prior to his or her election, a qualified voter in the city, and shall reside in the city throughout the term of office. To hold the office, if elected, you must not have been involved in a duel. Really, it says this in the Oath of Office! Councilpersons serve two-year terms; there are no term limits.

- 5. To access the necessary forms, you can visit this website: <u>Becoming a</u> Candidate.
- 6. Candidates must complete the proper paperwork to have their names printed on the ballot. The deadline for filing this paperwork with the Jefferson County Clerk is 4 pm on June 4th. There is an application fee of \$50. If you miss this deadline, you still have the option to register as a write-in candidate. The last day to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate is Friday, October 25, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. My advice is to file by June 4th.
- 7. Create a campaign budget. Ensure donations and expenditures of your campaign are reported periodically to the State. Typical expenses may include campaign yard signs, campaign flyers, meet-and-greet, social events, and other related costs.

# **Overnight Parking Ordinance**



We have noticed an increase in citations for overnight parking violations.

If you are expecting out-of-town guests, babysitters, or any other overnight visitors, kindly remind them about the <u>Parking Ordinance</u> to avoid any potential citations.

As a proactive measure, you may inform City Hall in advance if your driveway is being sealed or if any contracted work temporarily prevents you from parking in your driveway. This will help avoid the inconvenience of being ticketed.
